What do you do when you are caught between a rock and a hard place? What do you do when you need rescuing? To who or what do you turn?

It was a frightful time for the scrawny nation. There they were—stuck between the Red Sea and the Egyptian army. On one side, the Israelites faced death by drowning. On the other side, the army of their former captors was racing toward them, assuring them of a gruesome death. Israel had no chariots and horses, no spears and shields, no war plan. That's when all the grumbling and complaining started. Under God's guidance, Moses, their humble leader, stood up and encouraged them, "Do not be afraid. Stand firm and you will see the deliverance the Lord will bring you today . . . The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still" (Exodus 14:13-14). True, they had no weapons or ammunition, but they had something far superior. They had the Lord God of Israel. He promised to protect them, rescue them, and fight their battles for them. And He did.

Frankly, you'll never find yourself between a large body of water and a charging Egyptian army. At least, not any time soon. But you can sympathize with the Israelites, can't you? As God allows challenges, difficulties, tribulations, even life-threatening ones, in your life, you know it's so easy to gripe and complain, asking Him three of the most common questions: "Why me? Why this? And why now?"

Does it ever feel like darkness or midnight has descended upon you? Do you long for a new day? If so, rest easy. The difference between midnight and a new day is just 60 seconds. Don't panic. Take a deep breath. Let the Word of God spoken through Moses slowly infiltrate your ears, slip down into your heart, and calm your soul. "Do not be afraid. Stand firm and you will see the deliverance the Lord will bring you today . . . The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still." What grand, God-given advice! As New Testament believers, St. Paul would quickly add: Place your worry, your troubles, and your pain at the feet of Jesus' cross. Trust Him. Stand firm. Because at the cross, Jesus fought—and won—the biggest battle of your life. Behold, His empty tomb! Now you get to watch Him work through your current struggle or dilemma. He will deliver you just as He has promised.

Even now God continues to be your Rescuer, your Rock, and your Refuge. He fights for you—every moment of every day. Maybe God fights for you by giving you the strength to keep going. Maybe He fights for you by giving you a complete rescue or a miraculous healing. Maybe He will fight for you by taking you home to heaven, because a temporary loss on this earth is His eternal victory.

No matter how He decides to work, God's got this. Despite illness, sin, death, Satan, and an Egyptian army, He is in control. Trust Him. Stand firm. Be still. And behold His deliverance. After all, you are a part of His story, too, and He *alone* is your Rescuer.

#Called

This last weekend, July 21-22, was spent in Ruidoso, New Mexico with twenty-one people ranging from seventh grade to college age, along with five adults. It was a Rio Grande Circuit wide youth retreat, which resulted in teenagers coming from three El Paso churches, two from Las Cruces, one from Alamogordo, and one from Ruidoso, putting us at a total of seven churches partnering to encourage youth's faith growth.

Every person in attendance had fun as we spent our afternoon at Bonita Park Camp; mini-golf, horseshoes, and sand volleyball were outside games enjoyed as we all split in-between games, then we spent an hour playing an intense game of water polo at the inside pool. Afterwards, majority of the youth and a few of the adults showed their daring side as they took their turn at the 500-foot-long zip line, indoor rock climb, and 35-foot-tall Leap of Faith.

Despite the exhaustion of a long, fun filled day, the youth were eager to continue playing together once we returned to Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church, where we spent the night. Games of Uno, Mafia, Hide-n-Seek, and Murder in the Dark had them all interacting with each other, making new friends, and strengthening old friendships.

Not only did these teenagers enjoy the opportunity to meet others like themselves, but they also got to delve into Scripture together. It was amazing to see them make connections between Scripture and their lives!

We kicked off our retreat with the first of three Bible study series, all connected to our theme of #Called. In social media, the hashtag sign has become a tool used for three different purposes -to encourage change, to follow others with similar interests, and to continuously share information. Change, follow, and share -those are three reasons why we were called out of darkness and into His wonderful light, as Peter wrote in 1 Peter 2:9.

Saturday morning, we studied how we are all #Called to Change. Through a quick game, we were able to see in a very personal way how a world filled with temptations for us to become our own gods and focus inward on ourselves can make it a struggle to live a life dedicated to God. As children of God, we have been called to be different from what the world offers. Through the help of the Holy Spirit, we become more like Jesus and less like ourselves. We learn to be new creations through the study of God's Word.

Saturday evening, we moved on to how we are #Called to Follow. An awesome activity involving a blindfold, a guide, and screaming youth, we all were able to understand the difference between being a leader of the world and a follower of Christ. It was an amazing thing to see as these young people expressed their thoughts regarding following Jesus. Together, we explored the constant battle between going our own way and going the way of Christ. As His children, we understand we are called to follow Him throughout our lives by learning His voice through the study of Scripture; by doing so, we will become less likely to follow the strange voices of the enemy.

Sunday morning, we enjoyed a beautiful outside service with our Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church family, followed by affirmations and ending with our last Bible study, #Called to Share. Through the study of Scripture, we were able to see everything we share -from a common destiny as sinners, to a treasure of priceless worth in Jesus Christ. We learned how lives can be changed when we simply share God's love as He loved us -completely, unconditionally, and without reserve.

The weekend was an amazing time of joining and becoming a bigger family—we enjoyed every minute!



- 7. If an item does not sell, it will be returned to the donor.

Tithing—Is It for You?

Let us first clarify what tithing is. Perhaps you understand it to mean the giving of one tenth of your income to the Lord. That's true. We receive a different and truer perspective, however, when we think of it as follows: It is the returning to the Lord one tenth of all you have received from Him. When our focus is on what we have received from God rather than what we're required to give Him, joy and gratitude replace that sense of obligation.

When we tithe, our thinking gets straightened around. We begin to put God in first place, then ourselves and our families, our needs and wants, fall into place behind the first priority.

When we place our tithes into the offering plate as an act of worship, we are not just giving money; we are witnessing to our faith in God. We are agreeing with God that He can take care of us, that He won't let us flounder on our own, but that He will always be with us to provide for our needs.

We are saying to our fellow believers that we join with them in supplying the financial needs of our congregations so that the Word of God might be proclaimed, so that our church workers might be supported, so that those in need can receive help, so that our souls might be fed and nurtured, and so that the lost may hear the Gospel message.

When the tithe is practiced, a desire for even greater generosity fills us, for God doesn't have just the tithe, He now has the tither as well.



LUTHERAN'S ENGAGE, SUMMER 2018

A Smile during Difficult Times

For Migwa Stephen Ochieng, a joint program between The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya (ELCK) made all the difference. When Ochieng was a boy, his education nearly came to a premature end, despite the fact that he was one of the top students in the village. Ochieng's father died and his mother was unable to pay the fees to send him back to school.

The village chief heard about the family's difficulties and looked for someone who could assist them. He found that help with the ELCK, and Ochieng was enrolled in 1001 Orphans, a joint program of the ELCK and the LCMS that provided support for education and food for children in need. As students graduated from the program, they became eligible to receive an ongoing stipend to pursue higher education.

Thanks to 1001 orphans and generous donors around the Synod, Ochieng recently graduated from Kenya Medical Training College and passed his certification exam to become a registered nurse. "I want to take this opportunity to . . . thank the LCMS for the help they have given me til now. I am a graduate because of LCMS. LCMS gave me hope when I was hopeless, LCMS made me smile when I was [shedding] tears. I am now a nurse courtesy of LCMS," Ochieng wrote in an email to the LCMS field office in Nairobi, Kenya, after his graduation.

He also offered to volunteer with the LCMS and its Mercy Medical Teams "as a way of saying thanks to the Church and to everyone who made me [smile] during my difficult times in life."

Although 1001 Orphans no longer exists, the work continues and has even expanded. The Synod's Christ's Care for Children: Kenya program now matches sponsors in the United States with children at the LECK's Project 24 boarding-school facilities, where children receive schooling, food, medical care and the Word of God in a residential setting. The cost to sponsor a child is just \$90 per month. Sponsors receive an initial packet of information on their child, as well as updates, photos and the ability to correspond with the child throughout the years.

There are currently five Project 24 sites throughout Kenya, and a sixth site is slated to open in July. The new site, Nyambiri, will be able to provide for 40 boys and 40 girls from the area. "Not only do the children receive great care and an education, but more importantly they grow in their faith in God," said Britt Odemba, an LCMS missionary in Kenya who works with Project 24. "It is wonderful to see how the local Lutheran church has answered the call to

help the children within their congregations. It is a joy to see how the Body of Christ works together and assists their own."


