

We love our privacy in this country. We don't like "Big Brother" or anyone else for that matter watching over our shoulders. Technology companies don't ever want to let government agents into the data in their smartphones. Such a breach raises a great outcry.

Do you realize that God knows absolutely everything about you? In fact, He knows even the deepest thoughts of your heart. God said to Samuel, "Man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart" (1 Sam. 16:7). And He doesn't need technology to accomplish it. Does that scare you? Or does that reassure you? God's eves see it all, His ears hear it all, and His infinite RAM capacity is greater than all the servers on earth linked together. The Lord sees and knows it all!

The psalmist says, "From heaven the LORD looks

down and sees all mankind; from His dwelling place He watches all who live on earth" (Ps. 33:13-14). That's actually good news for believers. You may think of yourself as pretty small and insignificant—just another grain of sand on life's seashore. Compared to the trillions of stars in each of the trillions of galaxies in the limitless universe, you and I are, well, pretty microscopic indeed. But, in God's eyes, we are not insignificant! God pays close attention to every trivial detail, to everything about you. "You know when I sit and when I rise . . . Before a word is on my tongue You know it completely" (Ps. 139:2, 4).

The Lord God planned you from all eternity. He designed your shape. He loaded gifts and abilities into your DNA. He placed you in a unique location on earth. He chose you to be His very own. He cleansed you of your sin through your Baptism, and now has taken up residence in you—personally. He watches everything you do and say and think. And He takes immense delight



in your growth and development. "See, I have engraved you on the palms of My hands" (Is. 49:16).

That's how much you matter to the supreme Lord of the universe. It is a comfort for us to know that God sees us. When Hagar, Sarah's maid, was in distress, she said: "You are the God who sees me" (Gen. 16:13). God sees you and is aware of your needs, your afflictions, and your weaknesses. And these move Him to compassion.

All of this is possible because of Christ Jesus. We are God-reconciled, recognized children. We cannot see God with our natural eyes, but He sees us and provides for us, protects us, and will someday bring us to heaven, where we shall know all things and see Him face to face. 🕂







Stewardship Minute—Are You Saving for Retirement?

reports that, in 20 years, there will be a \$45 billion retirement income shortfall for retirement.

One of our top financial goals should be a comfortable retirement. To live comfortably during retirement, we can project that we will need approximately 80% of our pre-retirement income. This income will come from Social Security, pensions, and private savings. For most people, Social Security benefits will provide approximately one-third of their retirement needs. An im-

One of the greatest obstacles to a savings program for retirement is procrastination. We fall into the trap of telling ourselves that retirement is a long way off, so we will start saving next month. The problem is that next month never comes. Procrastination is detrimental, because it eats up the time that money can be put to work for us.

As a general rule of thumb, if we start saving for retirement in our 20s, we can set aside close to 10% of our incomes and have sufficient funds for retirement. As Solomon wrote, "... he who gathers money little by little makes it grow" (Proverbs 13:11). However, if we wait till we are in our 40s, our saving rate will have to increase to 30% or more.

Ascension Members Practice Stewardship of Their Time



It was a small group of six who came from Ascension Lutheran Church, located on the West side of El Paso, to help serve on Friday morning by putting together over 200 food baskets to give out for the weekly food distribution on Saturday morning. After a bit of translation, Marisa De Santiago, one of YLM's long-time volunteers, had them all organized and working hard, everything set out assembly line style for us.

"That's a lot of food they're getting," Barb Spott, a long-time member of Ascension Lutheran and chair of the Board of Stewardship, commented as she set out bags of rice, lentils, beans, and walnuts along the length of the table where food is grouped for over 25 bags at a time. With each food 'basket' containing cereal, rice, beans (three different kinds), lentils, peanut butter, walnuts, and other sundry items meant to last for a week or two, it did indeed seek like a lot of food -and that wasn't counting the extra items stored in the small walkin refrigerator in the back of the YLM Dining Hall, all of which were to be given out on Saturday!

At the end three hours, the count had been lost and the smiles had grown despite the heat, weariness and dirty hands left behind. "That was a lot of work," Mariann, another longterm member of Ascension, stated as she gave a tired smile, "But it was definitely rewarding."



The rewards of service continued for this group the next morning, them showed up early and eager to get to work in helping with the backyard!" distribution set to start at 10 in the

morning. After a brief tour of the YLM campus, as several of them had never been there before, they were all surprised and full of questions regarding all that is done at YLM and through YLM. Settling in to wait for the warehouse to open, they watched as people started lining up along either side of the closed warehouse door.

The quick distribution of jobs and explanation on how the distribution was to take place, everyone got to work, handing

out food baskets with big smiles, along with eggs, watermelon, corn on the cob and frozen pulled pork. Several of the men made trip after trip to vehicles, carrying boxes heavy with food. Despite the inability to communicate due to language barriers, smiles and head nods were enough to translate into gratitude and compassion.

These volunteers witnessed as person after person –young, elderly, with children and with disabilities -walked away with heavy loads and big smiles. Those who stayed within the warehouse kept the flow of food baskets and extra food items moving at a steady pace for the two-line system set up by Marisa De Santiago.

At the end of it all, everyone was exhausted, not to mention dirty, but each and every one of them had a smile full of joy and accomplishment.

"I've already had people come up to me to let me know they would like to participate the next time we do this. Those who went want to do it again, as well," Spott shared the Sunday after this service-full weekend, "And we definitely want to do this again."



Rev. Bestian, Pastor at Ascension Lutheran, explained why the Board of Stewardship had taken on this endeavor of volunteering time and talent at YLM, "Stewardship is more than responsibly managing money or giving money to those in need. 


