January Serving Schedule Bible Reading Plan he moment we unwrap the last Christmas present under the tree, we quickly turn our attention to the new year—and everything we're going to change about our lives to improve them. Attend Bible class. Eat healthier. Lose excess pounds. Exercise more. Get ample sleep. Stress less. Stop judging others. Clean the cat's litter box more often. Etc.

Realistically, we probably won't keep 95% of our resolutions. (I didn't keep my office desk clutter-free like I resolved to do last year.) Yet that doesn't keep us from trying to improve our situations and ourselves.

Did you know that God makes resolutions every year too—for our sake? And He keeps them 100% of the time! Granted, His have been the same for thousands of years because He never changes. Still, I thought this would be a good time to review all the resolutions God makes—and maybe those will help you keep your resolutions in perspective.

First, I will be with you. Writing through Isaiah, God promises, "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are Mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior" (Is. 43:1-3). Whatever the "waters, rivers, and fires" you face this year, God will be with you to deliver you. Your troubles won't separate you from Him—because you are His beloved and baptized child.

Second, I will help you. The psalmist pens, "But You, God, see the trouble of the afflicted; You consider their grief and take it in hand. The victims commit themselves to You; You are the helper of the fatherless" (Ps. 10:14). God isn't some disinterested, distant divine being in the sky. He is the Father. Better yet, He is your Father. He is committed to you—today, tomorrow, your whole life, and then for eternity.

Third, I will forget your sins. God reminds us, "I, yes I, am He who blots out your rebellious deeds for My own sake, and I will not remem-

ber your sins" (Is. 43:25). Maybe last year you resolved not to drink too much, to stop yelling at



the kids, to avoid fights on social media about politics. But, as usual, that didn't go so well. God says those sins aren't just brushed off with an "it's okay" (because sin isn't okay), but thanks to Jesus, they are wiped away and completely forgotten. Divine deliberate amnesia!

Fourth, **I** will give you rest. Jesus promises, "Come to Me all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, because I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matt. 11:28-29). You make resolutions because you want your days to go better. I hate to be a spoiler, but we all know that throughout this year we will have bad days. That's okay. God is there with gentleness for your weariness.

Finally, **I** will be there for you. God resolves, "And surely I am with you always until the end of the age" (Matt. 28:20). I know this is pretty much a repeat of the first point, but—if you're like me—it's so easy to forget that we're not alone. Whatever happens to you in 2020, God is with you. He isn't going anywhere.

Now, why am I so confident God will keep every one of these resolutions? Because Jesus had a resolution too: "As the time approached for Him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem" (Luke 9:51). Jesus resolved to go to the place where He would absorb the Father's wrath for your sin and where He would take your punishment in your place. Because He did that—and then came back to life, defeating death forever—your greatest problem has been overcome. God is thrilled to bless you, to act on your behalf, to rejoice over you, and to keep every single one of His resolutions to you. And that truth is what will make 2020—no matter what happens—a happy New Year! :

# Stewardship Minute—A New Year, New Opportunities

Each new day brings promise of a new start. For many, the start of a new week is the time to begin that diet, get serious about exercising, or forego TV viewing. For a vast majority, though, there's something especially motivating and invigorating about seeing the JANUARY calendar on the wall. This is the year we'll accomplish great things.

God doesn't necessarily call us to do great things, however. He asks that we be trustworthy in small things (Luke 16:10-11). To that end He gives us gifts to use to build up the Body of Christ and to reach out to the lost.

Some of us have many gifts. People like Michelangelo painter, sculptor, and poet—and Thomas Jefferson architect, statesman, and scientific farmer-come to mind. God, the Giver of gifts, knows that the number of gifts each of us has varies. Jesus told the Parable of the That's why God gives us gifts and abilities—that we may Talents pointing out this fact and teaching us that success lies in using what we've been given, not in having the greatest amount.

Our gifts also differ in degree. There are many sculptors but few, if any, compare to Michelangelo. Yet their art can bring satisfaction and inspiration to others. You may not be able to sing opera, but you can sing God's praises. You may not be a great orator, but you can witness to



the love and grace of God in Christ. You may not be a mechanic, but you can provide transportation for someone needing to get to an appointment or to church.

be equipped to serve others. The start of a new year offers us an opportune time to assess those gifts and see how we can use them for God's glory and the good of His people. The motivation to do this comes from the same One Who gave the gifts! Just as He was motivated by love for us to give us-not just our gifts-but His greatest gift, His Son, so we are motivated by love for Him to serve those He calls us to serve.

### What Is God's Will?

Have you ever stopped to think, really think, about what God's will for your life is?

It becomes this huge, overwhelming task to give our lives over to God's will, but what if I told you His will for your life can be boiled down to 3 simple things?

"Rejoice always, pray continuously, give thanks in every circumstance, this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

We let all the possibilities of what we would have to give up—careers, relationships, opportunities—become so much noise we can't see the simplicity of God's will. We start thinking on all the things we have to give up—our plans, our dreams, our wants and desires. It just clouds our minds and keeps us from doing the will of God, which is so simple!

### Pray continuously.

### Give thanks in all circumstances.

This, my friends, is the simple Formula of God's Will, and it's what we need to do as He guides us through the path He's chosen for us. In everything we do, as we fulfill or change dreams, we simply have to remember those three things.

### Give THANKS in ALL circumstances.

As we go about learning, growing, seeking Him in His Word, we do His will by rejoicing always, praying continuously, and giving thanks in all circumstances.

On 2019 Advent Wednesdays, we were able to bless five of our homebound brothers and sisters in Christ with warm fleece blankets tied by our Ascension Youth.



# 2020 Daily Bible Reading Plan

Is it time to read your Bible through from cover to cover? Why not do it? Set aside just ten minutes each morning before going to work. Make it a promise to yourself. We offer this Bible reading schedule to follow for 2020.

### Tips on Reading the Bible Daily

- 1. Start reading the Bible today—there is no better time, and there's no reason to wait.
- 2. Set aside a specific time each day. Set your schedule and then stick to it. Mornings are great, but feel free to use any time that works consistently for you.
- 3. Read the Bible for the sake of learning, not simply to accomplish your next reading. Highlight verses, take notes and bookmark. Say a short prayer to God before you begin, asking the Holy Spirit to give you wisdom and understanding, then be refreshed by the words you read!
