

Confession and Forgiveness


- **P** If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves,

Holy Gospel | Matthew 14:13-21


¹³When Jesus heard this, he withdrew from there in a boat to a deserted place to be alone. When the crowds heard this, they followed him on foot from the towns.


Benediction
