

- we confess that our faith wavers at times. We allow things of this world to produce uncertainty and fear within us. Although we believe in Your victory at the end of time, we fail to trust You to





Epistle Reading | 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10

¹Paul, Silas, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians, which is in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. ²We always give thanks to God for all of you as we make mention of you in our prayers, ³because we constantly remember before God our Father your work produced by faith, your labor produced by love, and your patient endurance produced by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁴Dear brothers, loved by God, we know that God has chosen you, ⁵because our gospel did not come to you with mere words, but with power, with the Holy Spirit, and with deep conviction. You yourselves know very well what kind of people we proved to be for your sake, while we were with you. ⁶You also became imitators of us and of the Lord, when you welcomed the Word during a time of great affliction with the joy from the Holy Spirit, ⁷so that you became a model for all the believers in Macedonia and Achaia. 8Indeed, the Word of the Lord has resounded from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but also in every place your faith in God has become known. As a result, we do not need to say anything, ⁹because they themselves inform us about what kind of reception we received from you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God. ¹⁰They also report how you patiently wait for His Son from heaven, whom He raised from the dead—Jesus, the one who is going to rescue us from the coming wrath.

¹⁵Then the Pharisees went out and plotted together how to trap Him in His words. ¹⁶They sent their disciples to Him along with the Herodians. "Teacher," they said, "we know that You are truthful and teach the way of God in accord with the truth. You are not concerned about gaining anyone's approval because You are not swayed by appearances. ¹⁷So tell us, what do You think? Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar or not?" ¹⁸But Jesus knew their evil purpose and said, "Why are you testing Me, hypocrites? ¹⁹Show Me the coin used for the tax." They brought Him a denarius. ²⁰He asked them, "Whose image and inscription is this?" ²¹"Caesar's," they replied to Him. Then He said to them, "Therefore give to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." ²²When they heard this, they were amazed. Then they left Him and went away.


