



(Silence for personal reflection and confession.)


- P Heavenly Father,

First Reading | Jeremiah 23:1-6

¹Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of My pasture! declares the LORD. ²Therefore, this is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds who shepherd My people. You have scattered My flock. You have driven them away. You have not taken care of them, but I will certainly take care of you, because of the evil things you have done, declares the LORD. ³I will gather what is left of My flock out of all the countries where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their pastures. They will be fruitful and multiply. ⁴I will raise up shepherds over them who will shepherd them. They will no longer be afraid or terrified, nor will any be missing, declares the LORD. ⁵Listen, the days are coming, declares the LORD, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, who will reign wisely as King and establish justice and righteousness on earth. ⁶In His days Judah will be saved and Israel will dwell securely. This is His name by which He will be called: The LORD Our Righteousness.

Second Reading | Ephesians 2:11-22

¹¹Therefore, remember that at one time, you Gentiles in the flesh—the ones who are called "uncircumcised" by those called "the circumcised" (which is performed physically by human hands)— ¹²remember that at that time you were separated from Christ, excluded from the citizenship of Israel, and foreigners to the covenants of the promise. You were without hope and without God in the world. ¹³But now in Christ Jesus, you who once were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ. ¹⁴For He Himself is our Peace. He made the two groups one by destroying the wall of hostility that divided them ¹⁵when He abolished the law of commandments and regulations in His flesh. He did this to create in Himself one new person out of the two, in this way making peace. ¹⁶And He did this to reconcile both to God in one body through the cross by putting the hostility to death on it. ¹⁷He also came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. ¹⁸For through Him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit. ¹⁹So then, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of God's household. ²⁰You have been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus Himself as the Cornerstone. ²¹In Him the whole building is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord. ²²In Him you too are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit.

Holy Gospel | Mark 6:30-44

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the sixth chapter.



³⁰The apostles gathered around Jesus and reported to Him all that they had done and taught. ³¹He said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a secluded place and rest a while." For there were so many people coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat. ³²They went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves. ³³But many people saw them leave and knew where they were going. They ran there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them. ³⁴When Jesus stepped out of the boat, He saw a large crowd. His heart went out to them because they were like sheep without a shepherd. He began to teach them many things. ³⁵It was already late in the day when His disciples came to Him and said, "This is a deserted place and it is already very late. ³⁶Send them away so they can go into the surrounding country and villages and buy themselves something to eat." ³⁷But He answered them, "You give them something to eat." They asked Him, "Should we go and buy two hundred denarii-worth of bread and give them something to eat?" ³⁸He said to them, "How many loaves do you have? Go see." When they found out, they said, "Five, and two fish." ³⁹He directed everyone to sit down in groups on the green grass. ⁴⁰They sat down in groups of hundreds and fifties. ⁴¹Jesus took the five loaves and the two fish, looked up to heaven, and blessed the loaves and broke them. Then He kept giving pieces to His disciples to set in front of them. He also divided the two fish among them all. ⁴²They all ate and were satisfied. ⁴³Then they picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces of bread and fish. ⁴⁴There were five thousand men who ate the loaves.






Words of Our Lord | Matthew 26:26-28; Mark 14:22-24; Luke 22:19-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-25
