Epistle Reading | James 3:13-4:10


¹³Who among you is wise and intelligent? Let him by his good way of living show that he does things in wise humility. ¹⁴But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your heart, do not boast and lie, contrary to the truth. ¹⁵This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but it is worldly, unspiritual, and demonic. ¹⁶In fact, where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and every bad practice. ¹⁷But the wisdom that comes from above is first pure, then also peaceful, gentle, reasonable, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial, and sincere. ¹⁸And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who practice peace. ¹Where do conflicts and quarrels among you come from? Don't they come from your cravings for pleasure, which are at war in the parts of your body? ²You want something but do not get it, so you murder. You desire something but cannot obtain it, so you guarrel and fight. You do not have because you do not ask. ³You ask, and yet do not receive, because you ask wrongly, so that you may spend it on what gives you pleasure. ⁴Adulterers, don't you know that friendship with the world means hostility toward God? So whoever wants to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God. ⁵Or, do you think that Scripture has no reason for saying that the Spirit, who lives in us, yearns jealously? ⁶But He gives greater grace! That is why it says, "God opposes the proud, but He gives grace to the humble." ⁷So, submit yourselves to God. Resist the Devil, and he will flee from you. 8Come near to God, and He will come near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded people. ⁹Lament, mourn, and weep. Let your laughter be changed into mourning and your joy into gloom. ¹⁰Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and He will lift you up.

Holy Gospel | Mark 9:30-37

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the ninth chapter.



³⁰They went on from there and passed through Galilee. He did not want anyone to know this, ³¹because He was teaching His disciples. He told them, "The Son of Man is going to be betrayed into the hands of men, and they will kill Him. But three days after He is killed, He will rise." ³²But they did

not understand the statement and were afraid to ask Him about it. ³³They came to Capernaum. When He was in the house, He asked them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" ³⁴But they remained silent, because on the way they had argued with one another about who was the greatest. ³⁵Jesus sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, "If anyone wants to be first, he will be the last of all and the servant of all." ³⁶Then He took a little child and placed him in their midst. Taking the child in His arms, He said to them, ³⁷"Whoever welcomes one of these little children in My name welcomes Me. And whoever welcomes Me, welcomes not just Me but also Him who sent Me."






Prayer before the Meal



Lord's Prayer




