Lighting of the Advent Wreath

- P On the four Sundays in Advent, we light a new candle each week. We mark the four candles with these four words: hope, peace, joy, and love. Jesus Christ is the hope of the nations.
- **W**e wait for the Lord, and in His Word do we hope.

The first candle on the Advent wreath is lit.

- P Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows Me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (John 8:12)
- **@** We light this candle anticipating the coming light of Christ.
- The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined." (Isaiah 9:2)
- Come, Lord Jesus, our Light and Life!
- Let us pray. Lord of hope, let the lighting of this candle signify that You are the light that shines in all the darkness of our lives. As we wait, watch, hope, and pray, guide us all to reflect Your light and let it shine; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Epistle Reading | 1 Thessalonians 3:9-13






Profession of Faith | Apostles' Creed


A I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.




