Transfiguration of the Lord

As We Gather:

Moses was an incredible man. God worked astounding miracles through Moses. He freed the Israelites from slavery in Egypt through Moses. He brought the Israelites to the Promised Land through Moses. After Moses died, no one could fill his shoes (or his sandals!). There were prophets, but none of them were like Moses. There were leaders, but none of them were like Moses.

Until Jesus. Jesus was not only like Moses, he was greater than Moses. "The Law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ." (John 1:17) Several months before Jesus died on the cross, he climbed a mountain with Peter, James, and John. There, he showed his disciples a tiny glimpse of his glory. And he spoke with Elijah – and Moses – about how he would die in Jerusalem. Everything Moses did and wrote, pointed to Jesus and his salvation. Every year at about this time, we in the church celebrate "Transfiguration Sunday". We remember this little preview of Jesus' glory – and his iron-willed commitment to suffer and die so that we could share that glory. Jesus is truly greater than Moses!



Deuteronomy 34:1-12

(Who could ever fill Moses' shoes?)

Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho. And the Lord showed him all the land, Gilead as far as Dan, ²all Naphtali, the land of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the western sea, ³the Negeb, and the Plain, that is, the Valley of Jericho the city of palm trees, as far as Zoar. ⁴And the Lord said to him, "This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, 'I will give it to your offspring.' I have let you see it with your eyes, but you shall not go over there." ⁵So Moses the servant of the Lord died there in the land of Moab, according to the word of the Lord, ⁶and he buried him in the valley in the land of Moab opposite Beth-peor; but no one knows the place of his burial to this day. ⁷Moses was 120 years old when he died. His eye was undimmed, and his vigor unabated. ⁸And the people of Israel wept for Moses in the plains of Moab thirty days. Then the days of weeping and mourning for Moses were ended.

⁹And Joshua the son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, for Moses had laid his hands on him. So the people of Israel obeyed him and did as the Lord had commanded Moses.

¹⁰And there has not arisen a prophet since in Israel like Moses, whom the Lord knew face to face, ¹¹none like him for all the signs and the wonders that the Lord sent him to do in the land of Egypt, to Pharaoh and to all his servants and to all his land, ¹²and for all the mighty power and all the great deeds of terror that Moses did in the sight of all Israel.



Olivia, receive the sign of the cross upon your forehead and upon your heart, to mark you as one rescued by Christ the crucified.

Prayer

Almighty God, we bring Olivia before you. We pray that you give her your Holy Spirit, so that she will have faith in Jesus as her Savior all the days of her life. Wash her from all evil, forgive her and help her to live as a new person. Let her know that she is your child. Give her your love every day and in the end, bring her to eternal life with you. In Jesus' name. Amen.

Words to the Parents

 P A little child is not able to take care of herself, but depends on her parents for everything. Olivia depends on you, not only for her physical food and care, but also with regard to her faith. It is good that you have brought her to be baptized! But afterwards you must raise her up in the Christian faith. Jesus said to make disciples by baptizing and also teaching. God is calling you to pray for Olivia, to teach her about Jesus, to show her how to follow Jesus, how to pray, how to understand the Bible. God wants you to encourage Olivia and bring her to join with other Christians in worship. Will you commit to doing this? If so, say, "I will, with the help of God."

Parents: I will, with the help of God.

● God enable you to do this faithful and loving work and with his grace fulfill what we are unable to do.

Parents: Amen.

- P Hear the Gospel according to Mark: "They brought young children to [Jesus] that he might touch them; but the disciples rebuked those who brought them. But when Jesus saw it, he was greatly displeased and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of God. Assuredly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will by no means enter it.' And he took them up in his arms, put his hands on them, and blessed them." This is the Word of the Lord.

Baptism Questions

P We believe that God can work faith in the hearts of little children just as much, if not more, than in older people. When children are very, very little, they cannot express in words what is in their hearts, and their parents answer for them. However, Olivia is old enough to express what is in her heart and mind and she would like to answer for herself.

Olivia, do you renounce all the devil's works and ways, that is, do you turn your back on the devil and everything bad?

Olivia: Yes, I don't want anything to do with them.

- ▶ Do you believe in God? I invite the whole congregation to join in this response, in the words of the Apostle's Creed:
- I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence he will come to judge the living and the dead. And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Baptismal Candle


(lighting the baptismal candle and giving it to the parents or the sponsors)

Today we celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion

Communion is one of the precious gifts that God gives to His people, as we receive the body and blood of our Savior, Jesus, who died on the cross to forgive all of our sins. To prepare for this sacrament, we follow the instruction found in 1 Corinthians 11:28: "*Let each man examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks the cup.*" Therefore, we ask that you review and affirm the following questions:

- 1. Do I believe I am a sinner without hope of eternal life, except for God's mercy offered through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ?
- 2. Do I repent of my sins and turn to Jesus as my personal Lord and Savior?
- 3. Do I believe that the bread and wine I receive is the true body and blood of Jesus, and not just a symbol of it?
- 4. Do I intend, with the help of God, to live a life that is pleasing to God?

We believe that your "yes" to these questions indicates a common faith with our Christian congregation and, therefore, we invite you to receive Holy Communion with us.

- The light-colored beverage in the center communion cups is non-alcoholic.
- Gluten free wafers are available. Just ask Pastor during distribution.
- Children and those not communing are welcomed to come forward for a blessing, but are not given communion until they have completed basic instruction classes on the Christian faith.

If you are unable to go to the altar, please let an usher know and the Pastor will bring the Lord's Supper to your pew. Please sit close to any of the three aisles in the church. Our Savior's wish is that all Christians receive His body and blood often.


