2nd Sunday in Lent Stand Firm in the Face of Christ's Enemies

March 16, 2025 • Ascension Lutheran Church • El Paso, Texas

As We Gather:

Many people live as enemies of the cross of Christ, but God calls us to do two things. <u>First, stand firm</u> (Philippians 3). Be like Jeremiah, who kept communicating God's Word even when it was unpopular and even led to death threats (Jeremiah 26). Be like Jesus, who continued on to Jerusalem in spite of his enemies' threats (Luke 13). But <u>secondly</u>, <u>love those enemies</u>. Don't repay evil with evil, but overcome evil with good. Jeremiah persevered because he loved his people and wanted them to repent and be saved. Jesus wanted to save and protect even his enemies like a hen gathers her chicks under her wings. He went to Jerusalem to die for them – and for us.

The Season of Lent

"Lent" is the period of 40 days right before Easter Sunday. This is a time for focusing on self-examination and repentance, and for receiving the forgiveness and peace and salvation that Jesus won for us on the cross.

The 40 days of Lent correspond with the 40 days that Jesus fasted in the desert (Matthew 4:1-2), the 40 days that Moses spent with God on Mt. Sinai (also called Mt. Horeb – Exodus 24:18), the 40 days that Elijah fasted as he walked to Mt. Sinai to meet with God (1 Kings 19:8), and the 40 years that Israel wandered through the desert (Numbers 14:33). Sundays are not included in the 40 days of Lent; they have a more joyful tone because Sunday is the day of the week that Jesus rose from the dead.

Some people practice fasting during Lent. Fasting is giving up something for a time in order to draw closer to God. Fasting is <u>not</u> an obligation but it is an option. Some people abstain from desserts or alcohol or meat during Lent. Other people give up watching TV or some other pleasurable activity. Still other people use the time of Lent as an opportunity to try to leave behind an old, bad habit. Fasting does not make you better than other people, but it does remind you that God is more important than any material thing or pleasure. Fasting encourages us to spend time in prayer. Fasting can also be an expression of repentance or of trusting in God alone in times of deep trouble. If you choose to fast in some way, do so humbly and responsibly, and make Jesus your focus and your priority.







Today we celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion

Communion is one of the precious gifts that God gives to His people, as we receive the body and blood of our Savior, Jesus, who died on the cross to forgive all of our sins. - 2. Do I repent of my sins and turn to Jesus as my personal Lord and Savior?
- 3. Do I believe that the bread and wine I receive is the true body and blood of Jesus, and not just a symbol of it?
- 4. Do I intend, with the help of God, to live a life that is pleasing to God?

We believe that your "yes" to these questions indicates a common faith with our Christian congregation and, therefore, we invite you to receive Holy Communion with us.

- The light-colored beverage in the center communion cups is non-alcoholic.
- Gluten free wafers are available. Just ask Pastor during distribution.
- Children and those not communing are welcomed to come forward for a blessing, but are not given communion until they have completed basic instruction classes on the Christian faith.

If you are unable to go to the altar, please let an usher know and the Pastor will bring the Lord's Supper to your pew. Please sit close to any of the three aisles in the church. Our Savior's wish is that all Christians receive His body and blood often. Ascension offers gluten free communion wafers for those who are protein/gluten intolerant or may have a wheat allergy. Simply notify the Pastor during communion if you desire a glutenfree wafer.


