3rd Sunday in Lent Warning! Turn Back!

March 23, 2025 ● Ascension Lutheran Church ● El Paso, Texas

As We Gather:

Why do tragedies happen? Were the people who have died in earthquakes or fires or pandemics, worse sinners than the rest of us? Jesus says no (Luke 13:1-5). However, these terrible events are warnings. All of us are far from perfect – if you think you are strong, be careful lest you fall! (1 Corinthians 10:1-13) We all deserve to suffer the consequences of our sin. God is delaying the final judgment only to give us an opportunity to turn to him (Luke 13:6-9). Like with Ezekiel, God wants to work through us to warn our friends, neighbors, co-worker, and acquaintances. He does not want anyone to perish (Ezekiel 33:7-20). Jesus died for all of us! How terrible that sometimes it takes a tragedy to shake a person into thinking about God – or to get us Christians to remember that time is short and that many people are still far from the love of Jesus.

The Season of Lent

"Lent" is the period of 40 days right before Easter Sunday. This is a time for focusing on self-examination and repentance, and for receiving the forgiveness and peace and salvation that Jesus won for us on the cross.

The 40 days of Lent correspond with the 40 days that Jesus fasted in the desert (Matthew 4:1-2), the 40 days that Moses spent with God on Mt. Sinai (also called Mt. Horeb – Exodus 24:18), the 40 days that Elijah fasted as he walked to Mt. Sinai to meet with God (1 Kings 19:8), and the 40 years that Israel wandered through the desert (Numbers 14:33). Sundays are not included in the 40 days of Lent; they have a more joyful tone because Sunday is the day of the week that Jesus rose from the dead.

Some people practice fasting during Lent. Fasting is giving up something for a time in order to draw closer to God. Fasting is not an obligation but it is an option. Some people abstain from desserts or alcohol or meat during Lent. Other people give up watching TV or some other pleasurable activity. Still other people use the time of Lent as an opportunity to try to leave behind an old, bad habit. Fasting does not make you better than other people, but it does remind you that God is more important than any material thing or pleasure. Fasting encourages us to spend time in prayer. Fasting can also be an expression of repentance or of trusting in God alone in times of deep trouble. If you choose to fast in some way, do so humbly and responsibly, and make Jesus your focus and your priority.





He has done what is just and right; he shall surely live.

(If you think you're strong, be careful lest you fall!)


¹I want you to know, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, ²and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, ³and all ate the same spiritual food, ⁴and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they

drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ. ⁵Nevertheless, with most of them God was not pleased, for they were overthrown in the wilderness.

⁶Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did. ⁷Do not be idolaters as some of them were; as it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink and rose up to play." ⁸We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day. ⁹We must not put Christ to the test, as some of them did and were destroyed by serpents, ¹⁰nor grumble, as some of them did and were destroyed by the Destroyer. ¹¹Now these things happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come. ¹²Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall. ¹³No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.

Sermon The Watchman (Ezekiel 33:7-20)

Baptism

Scripture Reading

- P Jesus Christ says in the last chapter of Matthew: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." In the last chapter of Mark, Jesus promises: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved."
- Amadeus, receive the sign of the cross upon your forehead and upon your heart, to mark you as one rescued by Christ the crucified.

Prayer

Almighty God, we bring Amadeus before you. We pray that you give him your Holy Spirit, so that he will have faith in Jesus as his Savior all the days of his life. Wash him from all evil, forgive him and help him to live as a new person. Let him know that he is your child. Give him your love every day and in the end, bring him to eternal life with you. In Jesus' name. Amen.

Words to the Parents and Godparents

P A little child is not able to take care of herself, but depends on her parents for everything. Amadeus depends on you, not only for his physical food and care, but also with regard to his faith. It is good that you have brought him to be baptized! But afterwards you must raise him up in the Christian faith. Jesus said to make disciples by baptizing and also teaching. God is calling you to pray for Amadeus, to teach him about Jesus, to show him how to follow Jesus, how to pray, how to understand the Bible. God wants you to encourage Amadeus and bring him to join with other Christians in worship. Will you commit to doing this? If so, say, "I will, with the help of God."

Parents and Godparents: I will, with the help of God.

P God enable you to do this faithful and loving work and with his grace fulfill what we are unable to do.

Parents and Godparents: Amen.

- Hear the Gospel according to Mark: "They brought young children to [Jesus] that he might touch them; but the disciples rebuked those who brought them. But when Jesus saw it, he was greatly displeased and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of God. Assuredly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will by no means enter it.' And he took them up in his arms, put his hands on them, and blessed them." This is the Word of the Lord.

Baptism Questions

We believe that God can work faith in the hearts of little children just as much, if not more, than in older people. Nevertheless, very little children cannot yet express what is in their hearts. Therefore I ask you parents and godparents to answer for Amadeus just as you speak for him and protect him in many other ways.

Do you renounce all the devil's works and ways?

Parents and Godparents: Yes, Amadeus and we renounce them.

- **P** Do you believe in God? I invite the whole congregation to join in this response, in the words of the Apostle's Creed:
- I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell.

On the third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence he will come to judge the living and the dead. And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

P This is the Christian faith. Do you wish to baptize Amadeus in this faith? **Parents and Godparents: Yes.**

Baptism

Amadeus Moreno, I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Blessing

Parents and Godparents: (placing hands on child) May God bless you and keep you strong in faith. Amen.

Congregation: (extending hands towards the newly baptized) May Almighty God, who has given you the new birth of water and of the Spirit and has forgiven you, strengthen you in faith until Jesus comes again. Amen.

Baptismal Candle

(lighting the baptismal candle and giving it to the parents or the godparents)
Receive this burning light to show that you belong now to Christ, the Light of the world. Live always in the light of Christ. Amen.

You may extinguish the candle now, to take it home. May I suggest that you keep the candle in a special place and take it out and light it on special occasions such as Amadeus' birthday, or on the anniversary of his baptism. Light it with him and remind him that God loves him, that he is baptized, that he belongs to the Lord, and that Jesus wants him to live in the light, in faith and love. Amen.



Any donations of no longer needed household items, or gently used clothing, shoes, toys, & furniture would be used for their yard sale fundraising effort.



The Thursday morning Bible study is studying 1, 2,3 John. We meet at the church on Thursday mornings.




