#### As We Gather:

When a child gets lost, it is fear-inspiring for both the child and his or her parents. A part of your heart is missing!

Often we are estranged from God – lost! – by the things that we do, say, and think that are not right. Sometimes we wander far from the Lord. But God is always more ready to forgive than we are to ask for forgiveness. He wants to be reconciled with us (2) Corinthians 5:16-21). That's why he sent Jesus! Thank the Lord for his undeserved love in restoring our relationship with him (Isaiah 12:1-6)! May he give us that same love for those who are still "lost" (Luke 15:11-32)!

#### The Season of Lent

"Lent" is the period of 40 days (not counting the Sundays!) right before Easter Sunday. This is a time for focusing on self-examination and repentance, and for receiving the forgiveness and peace and salvation that Jesus won for us on the cross.
