As We Gather:

It was the night before Jesus would die on the cross. He was with his disciples sharing the last supper with them. Jesus knew that soon the disciples would all be terrified at what would happen, and they would all run away. But he told them that he wanted them to have peace. We will have plenty of trouble in this world; but Jesus has overcome the world (John 16:23-33).

Are you worried? Do your problems seem insurmountable? Are you stuck trying to decide what to do?

Paul wanted to go to Bithynia and couldn't. He wanted to go to Asia and couldn't. But as he wrestled with what to do, God guided him to Macedonia – straight to Lydia who needed to hear about Jesus (Acts 11:9-15).

When you don't know what to do or when your situation seems impossible, remember that Jesus has overcome the world. Wait for God, because at the right time he will guide you. And in the end, he will take you to be with him in heaven (Revelation 21).

The Season of Easter

Easter is not just a single day – it is also a 50-day celebration from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. The season of Easter lasts about 1/7 of the entire year. During this time, the worship services focus on resurrection and life and the victory of Jesus.
