As We Gather

What would you do if God himself appeared right in front of you? What would you say? King David thought that being in God's presence would be the best thing in the world. He said, "One thing have I asked of the Lord, this I will seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord and to inquire in his temple." (Psalm 27:4)

We don't really deserve to be in God's presence. Our wrongdoing alienates us from God. But Jesus died for us and he reconciles us with God – and through faith in Jesus we are "holy and blameless and above reproach" in God's presence (Colossians 1:21-22).

As we gather together for worship today, God is with us. Jesus said, "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them." (Matthew 18:20) Like Mary, today we sit at Jesus' feet to learn from him (Luke 10:18-42). Like Abraham, today we receive God's blessing (Genesis 18:1-14). Like Paul, the author of the book of Colossians, today we go out ready to sacrifice our own comfort so that others may come to faith in Jesus and come into be in the presence of God as well (Colossians 1:21-28).

Sermon: One Thing Needed (Luke 10:38-42)

Nicene Creed (Public declaration of our faith)

Invitation and Preparation for Communion

Today we celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion, one of the precious gifts that God gives to His people. In Communion, God wants to assure us that we have been forgiven through faith in Jesus who gave his body and blood for us on the cross.

To prepare for Communion, we follow what 1 Corinthians 11:28 says: "Let each man examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks the cup." Therefore, if you wish to participate in Communion today, we ask that you review and affirm the following questions:

- 1. Do I believe I am a sinner, that is, that I have failed to keep God's commands as I should, and that I need forgiveness?
- 2. Do I trust in Jesus as my personal Lord and Savior, who died and rose for me?
- 3. Do I believe as I eat the bread and drink the cup, that I also receive the true body and blood of Jesus that He gave for me on the cross even though I can't fully explain it?
- 4. Do I intend, with the help of God, to follow Jesus more closely and obey him more faithfully?

If you answer "yes" to these questions, then you share a common faith with our Christian congregation and you are welcome to receive Holy Communion with us. Our common faith is expressed in more detail in the Creed that we confess together during the worship service.

Special Instructions for Communion:

- <u>Children and those who are not communing</u> are welcomed to come forward for a blessing. Children do not commune until they have completed basic instruction classes about the Christian faith.
- If you are <u>unable to go to the altar</u>, please let an usher know and the Pastor will bring the Lord's Supper (Communion) to your pew. Please sit close to any of the three aisles in the church.
- During Communion, <u>gluten-free communion wafers (bread)</u> are available. Just ask the Pastor when he comes to give you the bread.
- During Communion, you may take one of the <u>small communion cups</u> from the tray, or you may wait and drink from the common cup.

• On the tray of small communion cups, those cups in the center of the tray have light-colored, non-alcoholic <u>grape juice</u>. The other cups have <u>wine</u>.
