As We Gather

"If I only had enough money, then things would be great." It's so easy to think that way. After all, money (and material things) is a blessing from God. And money seems to solve any number of problems. With enough money, you can travel first class instead of being cramped in the economy seats. With enough money, you can enjoy the finest cuisine and stay at the best resorts. With enough money, you can buy whatever your heart desires. Many of us spend our adult lives accumulating "stuff". We seem to have bought into the popular saying "He who dies with the most toys wins."

But in reality, "He who dies with the most toys" still dies. And then what? Jesus told people about a fool who struck it rich but was unprepared to die (Luke 12:13-21). Ecclesiastes (chapters 1 and 2) declares that running after material things and physical wealth is meaningless and useless. Riches don't satisfy (you always want more) and they don't last.

So what can we do? Colossians 3:1-11 tells us to set our minds on things above, not earthly things. Put Jesus first! Rely on Jesus for forgiveness and live for him. Then money and material things will not be our gods but our servants. With Jesus' help we will be able to use them as blessings from God rather than being slaves to them.



Scripture Reading

- Henri, receive the sign of the cross upon your forehead and upon your heart, to mark you as one rescued by Christ the crucified.

Prayer

Almighty God, we bring Henri before you. We pray that you give him your Holy Spirit, so that he will have faith in Jesus as his Savior all the days of his life. Wash him from all evil, forgive him and help him to live as a new person. Let him know that he is your child. Give him your love every day and in the end, bring him to eternal life with you. In Jesus' name. Amen.

Words to the Parents and Godparents

P A little child is not able to take care of himself, but depends on his parents for everything. Henri depends on you, not only for his physical food and care, but also with regard to his faith. It is good that you have brought him to be baptized! But afterwards you must raise him up in the Christian faith. Jesus said to make disciples by baptizing and also teaching. God is calling you to pray for Henri, to teach him about Jesus, to show him how to follow Jesus, how to pray, how to understand the Bible. God wants you to encourage Henri and bring him to join with other Christians in worship. Will you commit to doing this? If so, say, "I will, with the help of God."

Parents and Godparents: I will, with the help of God.

P God enable you to do this faithful and loving work and with his grace fulfill what we are unable to do.

Parents and Godparents: Amen.

Hear the Gospel according to Mark: "They brought young children to [Jesus] that he might touch them; but the disciples rebuked those who brought them. But when Jesus saw it, he was greatly displeased and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of God. Assuredly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will by no means enter it.' And he took them

up in his arms, put his hands on them, and blessed them." This is the Word of the Lord.

Baptism Questions

We believe that God can work faith in the hearts of little children just as much, if not more, than in older people. Nevertheless, very little children cannot yet express what is in their hearts. Therefore I ask you parents and godparents to answer for Henri just as you speak for him and protect him in many other ways.

Do you renounce all the devil's works and ways?

Parents and Godparents: Yes, Henri and we renounce them.

- P Do you believe in God? I invite the whole congregation to join in this response, in the words of the Apostle's Creed:
- P This is the Christian faith. Do you wish to baptize Henri in this faith? Parents and Godparents: Yes.

Baptism

P Henri Robert Reulet, I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Blessing

Parents and Godparents: (placing hands on child) May God bless you and keep you strong in faith. Amen.

Congregation: (extending hands towards the newly baptized) May Almighty God, who has given you the new birth of water and of the Spirit and has forgiven you, strengthen you in faith until Jesus comes again. Amen.

Baptismal Candle

(lighting the baptismal candle and giving it to the parents or the godparents)
Receive this burning light to show that you belong now to Christ, the Light of the world. Live always in the light of Christ. Amen.

You may extinguish the candle now, to take it home. May I suggest that you keep the candle in a special place and take it out and light it on special occasions such as Henri' birthday, or on the anniversary of his baptism. Light it with him and remind him that God loves him, that he is baptized, that he belongs to the Lord, and that Jesus wants him to live in the light, in faith and love. Amen.

Invitation and Preparation for Communion

Today we celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion, one of the precious gifts that God gives to His people. In Communion, God wants to assure us that we have been forgiven through faith in Jesus who gave his body and blood for us on the cross.

To prepare for Communion, we follow what 1 Corinthians 11:28 says: "Let each man examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks the cup." Therefore, if you wish to participate in Communion today, we ask that you review and affirm the following questions:

- 1. Do I believe I am a sinner, that is, that I have failed to keep God's commands as I should, and that I need forgiveness?
- 2. Do I trust in Jesus as my personal Lord and Savior, who died and rose for me?
- 3. Do I believe as I eat the bread and drink the cup, that I also receive the true body and blood of Jesus that He gave for me on the cross even though I can't fully explain it?
- 4. Do I intend, with the help of God, to follow Jesus more closely and obey him more faithfully?

If you answer "yes" to these questions, then you share a common faith with our Christian congregation and you are welcome to receive Holy Communion with us. Our common faith is expressed in more detail in the Creed that we confess together during the worship service.


Special Instructions for Communion:


- <u>Children and those who are not communing</u> are welcomed to come forward for a blessing. Children do not commune until they have completed basic instruction classes about the Christian faith.
- If you are <u>unable to go to the altar</u>, please let an usher know and the Pastor will bring the Lord's Supper (Communion) to your pew. Please sit close to any of the three aisles in the church.
- During Communion, <u>gluten-free communion wafers (bread)</u> are available. Just ask the Pastor when he comes to give you the bread.
- During Communion, you may take one of the <u>small communion cups</u> from the tray, or you may wait and drink from the <u>common cup</u>.
- On the tray of small communion cups, those cups in the center of the tray have light-colored, non-alcoholic <u>grape juice</u>. The other cups have <u>wine</u>.
