## Eleventh Sunday After Pentecost Heaven is Wide But the Door is Narrow

#### As We Gather

Will there be many people in heaven? Yes and no. On the one hand, heaven has plenty of room and God wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth (1 Timothy 2:3-4). In heaven there will be a multitude of people from every nation under the sun (Isaiah 66:18-23).



But on the other hand, there is only one way for sinners like us to get into heaven, and that is through Jesus Christ. Jesus is the only one who died for our sins, and he is the only one who rose from the dead to give us eternal life. The door to get into heaven is narrow (Luke 13:23-24). People who reject Jesus will find themselves outside. Jesus said that even some of his own neighbors would find themselves excluded because they rejected him as Savior, while others from the east and west, north and south, would be at God's banquet feast (Luke 13:25-30).

Jesus, who died for us on Mount Calvary, is the only way for us to leave behind Mount Sinai (judgment on sin) and come to Mount Zion (salvation from sin). That's the message of the reading from Hebrews 12:18-29.

So are there many people in heaven? Yes, there will be followers of Jesus from every nation under the sun! But Jesus warns that there will also be many people on the outside. Go through the narrow door – Jesus!

<sup>18</sup>For you have not come to what may be touched, a blazing fire and darkness and gloom and a tempest <sup>19</sup>and the sound of a trumpet and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that no further messages be spoken to them. <sup>20</sup>For they could not endure the order that was given, "If even a beast touches the mountain, it shall be stoned." <sup>21</sup>Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear." <sup>22</sup>But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, <sup>23</sup>and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, <sup>24</sup>and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

<sup>25</sup>See that you do not refuse him who is speaking. For if they did not escape when they refused him who warned them on earth, much less will we escape if we reject him who warns from heaven. <sup>26</sup>At that time his voice shook the earth, but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also

the heavens." <sup>27</sup>This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of things that are shaken—that is, things that have been made—in order that the things that cannot be shaken may remain. <sup>28</sup>Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, <sup>29</sup>for our God is a consuming fire.
