As We Gather

A couple of months ago, I couldn't find my phone. It wasn't in any of the usual places and no ring tone sounded when I tried to use a different phone to call my number. I began to think that I had left it at some store or other when I was out running errands. I got a hollow feeling in the pit of my stomach. Losing a phone means



also losing your family photos and videos, your messages, your list of contacts. But I didn't give up. I took a moment to pray – and just a bit later found the phone. It was on the kitchen table, hidden under some papers, on silent mode.

The feeling we get when we have lost something – or someone – is a weak version of how God feels about human beings who are far from him. We are all precious to God. He created us and he loves us. And yet so many people have turned their backs on him and live just for themselves – and are in danger of suffering eternal consequences.

The Bible says that God yearns for us to come back to him. Like a woman searching for a lost coin or a shepherd seeking a lost sheep, God reaches out to us (Luke 15:1-10). Jesus came to earth to save sinners (1 Timothy 1:12-17). Heaven rejoices when someone who was "lost" is "found". And if we are among the "found", then God wants us to share his love for the "lost." We are not to be selfish, self-centered sheep, but sheep who help seek those who are far from God (Ezekiel 34:11-24).
